HIV and Hep C Services are available @ PARN

PARN provides a range of services for people living with HIV and/or Hep C and people affected by HIV and/or Hep C. PARN works to promote the well-being and independence of people living with or at risk for HIV and/or Hep C in the counties of Peterborough, Northumberland, Haliburton and Kawartha Lakes by providing services such as: counseling, workshops, and information on progression and treatment of the condition for themselves and their families; referrals to other service providers; basic necessities to those in need; and assistance with other health issues.

Positive Care Clinic - Every Tuesday & Thursday @ PARN

The Positive Care Clinic provides HIV and hepatitis C testing and treatment in Peterborough at the PARN site on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The clinic is provided through a partnership between Lakeridge Health and PARN.

The Positive Care Clinic provides individual assessment and follow-up care, nutrition and medication counselling, laboratory work (blood work), and education opportunities. Services are fully funded by the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care.

Love Positive Women

February 1-14, 2020

Saturday February 1st marked the first day of Love Positive Women, 2020. Love Positive Women is a global project that raises awareness about women and girls living with HIV using social media to link local grassroots gestures of love. Using Valentine's Day as a backdrop, Love Positive Women creates a platform for communities and individuals to engage in public and privates acts of love and caring for women living with HIV.

Going beyond romantic love, Love Positive Women is a call to action. It requires participants to spend time reflecting about how they, as either a woman living with HIV, or an ally, will commit to loving women living with HIV. Working from a place of strength Love Positive Women focuses on the idea of interconnectedness, relationship building, loving oneself and loving ones community. When we start from a place of love, there are endless ways to build strong communities.

This year in Recognition of Love Positive Women WHAI@PARN is participating in a provincial card exchange as well as providing opportunities for connection, skill building and fun for HIV positive women in our community. In addition we will be posting relevant content to the WHAI@PARN and the @PARN Facebook pages.

As the global HIV community moves forward with its 90-90-90 targets and we celebrate the era of U=U, we must also continue to hold space for the people for whom 90-90-90 and U=U is inaccessible. HIV work is social justice work, Love Positive Women reminds us that our work is not done and that achieving optimal health outcomes can only happen when the solutions are driven by the brilliance and expertise of those living with and affected by HIV. February 1st also marks the first day of Black History Month and presents us with an opportunity to reflect on the intersections of identity that define the people we know, love and work with, as well as those we have never met. Love Positive Women is a reminder of and an anchor to our global community.

Support Program Coordinator

The Support Program Coordinator will coordinate the development, delivery and evaluation of programs and services for people who are living with, affected by and at risk of HIV, hepatitis C and other blood-borne infections. Working closely with the Peer Engagement and Harm Reduction programs the Program Coordinator will provide supportive counselling, access to resources and skills development opportunities to individuals living throughout the four-county region including two prisons. This is not an entry level position.

The successful candidate will develop, recommend and implement a work-plan framed by GIPA/MEPA, the social determinants of health, the care and treatment cascade and the principles of harm reduction and a budget for the delivery of the program, monitoring progress throughout the year and taking corrective action.

The incumbent will be equally adept working with people who experience systemic barriers, service providers, decision makers and peers. The Coordinator will represent PARN and our communities at provincial meetings and locally with diverse agencies, organizations and groups that provide supports and services to people who are living with HIV and people at risk.

Harm Reduction Outreach Workers (2)

Two Outreach Worker positions available in Peterborough, Kawartha Lakes, Haliburton and Northumberland Counties. One position is for a one year parental leave and the other is a permanent position.





Offering expedited, barrier-free treatment and counseling for patients who are addicted to alcohol or opioids, Peterborough Regional Health Centre's Rapid Access Addiction Medicine (RAAM) clinic is staffed by PRHC doctors and nurses and FourCAST addiction counselors, and serves clients from Peterborough, Kawartha Lakes, Northumberland and Haliburton.

> Treatment and counseling are available free of charge on a walk-in basis. Referrals from other healthcare providers are welcome, but not necessary.

The RAAM clinic works in partnership with FourCAST and Peterborough AIDS Resource Network (PARN) to ensure our clients are supported through the continuum of their care. We are co-located with PARN, which provides access to a full range of harm reduction services, including needle exchange, outreach services and naloxone distribution.
