- □ Support Services: Working with registered client base living with HIV and/or AIDS in-person or via remote online conference platforms, delivering educational workshops to clients on general health and wellness topics and presenting issues related to living with HIV and/or AIDS, producing educational health promotion materials, coordinating and facilitating monthly social support group, seeking referrals to other community agencies when applicable, organizing and maintaining the client emergency food pantry program, coordinating seasonal events for clients in the summer and winter, supporting ongoing delivery of department activities and functions
- □ Harm Reduction Works: Working with, and supporting folks who use substances, creating harm reduction kits to be distributed across Peterborough to reduce the chance of HIV and HEP C transmission, completing brief, informal counseling with service users, accompanying the outreach team to various satellite locations, discussing safer substance use with service users, referring service users to community agencies when applicable
- □ Woman and HIV Initiative (WHAI): Working with community partners and other women serving agencies to promote women's health, working with cis, trans women and non-binary folks who are living with HIV/AIDS, Hep C or at risk of transmission, supporting/leading community education projects, organizing events for women, coordinating and creating social media posts.
- □ Gay, Bisexual, Men who have sex with Men (GBMSM) Community Engagement: Engaging with the GBMSM community members, conducting presentations for other agencies to promote topics like safe sex, HIV testing, stigma, harm reduction, coordinating and creating social media posts, tabling events such as health fairs and pride events
- □ Hep C Services: Supporting folks living with, or at risk for Hepatitis C transmission, connecting service users to testing and treatment, assisting service users navigate the healthcare system, engaging in outreach to educate others on what Hep C is, what it does and how it can be prevented, engaging in harm reduction to reduce potential transmission
